



Cane Supply Field Officer

Job Description	Responsible for maintaining the harvest management plan, liaising with harvesters to ensure sufficient supply of cane to the factories, and associated administration.
Minimal Educational Requirements for Commencement	Minimum senior standard. Tertiary qualifications would be an advantage.
Study Required or Career Progression	Usually Field Officers rise through the ranks of the business commencing in the Cane Supply department on locomotive crews or as juniors with an agricultural background. A number of specialties have grown over the years, ranging from Communications Centre Operations to Geospatial Information Systems (GIS) Officer. All positions require some additional study.
Apprenticeship or Bond	No.
Normal Hours	38 hour week, plus additional hours to meet the needs of the business. The times of work vary through the year, with many Field Officers working shift rosters in order to maintain contact with growers and harvesting contractors at various hours of their working day.
Remuneration	\$65,000 to six figures depending upon experience, qualifications, responsibility and operating level in the business.
Career Prospects	Specialty roles ranging from Operations Centre Officers to Geospatial Information Systems (GIS) Officer including supervision and management roles.
Other	Some computer skills would be an advantage along with a need to be a good communicator, with the capacity to form harmonious working relationships with a wide range of people.
